



Early Education Supports Help California's Children Early Head Start provides child and family development services for infants, toddlers, and pregnant women. Centerbased EHS programs provide diapers for infants and toddlers. Other federally funded child care assistance programs don't. For families enrolled in the latter, not having access to diapers removes a key building block for strong families. Without diapers a parent can't go to work, and not working disqualifies a parent from vital child care resources.
